Summary

Ideas for Classroom Use

Discussion Questions

Discussion questions - encourage children to find examples from the story to document their answers.

Why do you think Slue Foot Sal “runs the house” at Pecos Bill and Slue Foot Sues place?

Why did the Ike send two hamsters? What began to happen?

How do you think the hamsters got loose?

Describe the “Great Texas Hamster Drive”. How many hamsters were driven to Abilene?

What caused the hamsters to stampede? What happened next?

How did they get the hamsters out of the tunnel and herded onto the train to Chicago?

Were gerbils going to be a problem? Why or why not?

Responding to the Text

Writing Tall Tales

Oh, those silly hamsters have a mind of their own! One gets distracted on the way to Abilene and decides to go off on his/her own and explore! Encourage your children to create a tall tale of their own, sharing the adventures of their very own hamster of the Wild West! In their tall tale, encourage children to include exaggeration, humor, hardships to overcome, and a hero or heroine that saves the day.

In sharing the tall tales, encourage children to draw a picture of their hamster involved in his/her outrageous adventures. Children might sit around an indoor “campfire” and share their wild and wonderful stories with one another before posting the pictures and stories on a “Wanted!” or a “Great Texas Hamster Drive” Bulletin Board.
